Late Summer Lawns & Gardens

Summer is winding down, but our landscapes still have a number of weeks left before they start to prepare for colder weather. Here are three things to consider as we head into the last weeks of summer.

- ▶ Dial Back Watering—Warm days aren't finished, but the hottest temperatures of the summer are likely behind us. Combine that with days getting slightly shorter and the fact that lawns are all fully established, and you have the right ingredients to shorten sprinkler times by several minutes on your watering days. See the recommended run times above.
- ▲ Try Fall Planting—Soil temperatures are warm and there's still plenty of sun. These make for ideal conditions to get starter plants into garden beds. Planting perennials in September can often give them plenty of time to establish before the weather turns. The best part is come next spring, much of your garden work may already be finished when perennial blooms return.
