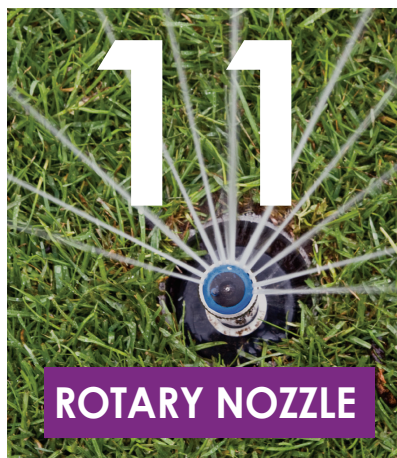
Recommended Minutes **PER CYCLE** by Sprinkler Type



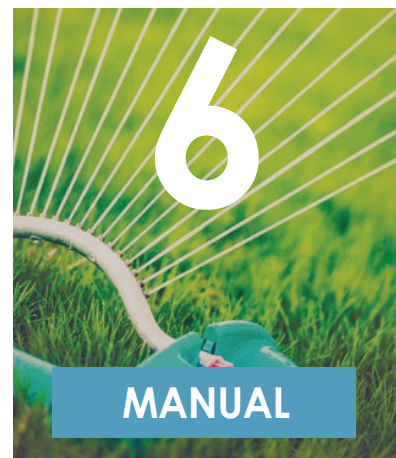

Dry Summer Survival

Even if hot and dry conditions continue through August, the good news is that if landscapes have made it this far, they're likely to survive the rest of the summer. Please continue to observe the mandatory two-day per week watering schedule, and keep the following in mind.

- 💧 **Trees:** Get the garden trowel and dig down two inches near the base of trees. The soil at that depth should be moist. If it's dry to the touch the tree needs water. If it's soggy, it's getting too much water. When trees need watering, the Arbor Day Foundation recommends 10-gallons (two full hardware store buckets) for each inch of tree diameter.
- 💧 **Yards:** Check out the graphic on the lower right. Yards should have a noticeable blend of green and straw-colored hues right now. That's a sign the lawn is still alive but protecting itself from mid-summer heat. Given the intense drought we are in, lush, green grass is almost a sure indicator of watering violations.
- 💧 Get free support and helpful discounts for water-efficient landscapes. ECCV customers can still sign-up for free sprinkler system assessments to maximize every drop when sprinklers run. Customers interested in turning landscapes into a little less lawn and a little more garden can also receive up to \$750 in discounts for turf removal services.
